EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

HEDC staff has researched several programs to provide financial assistance to small businesses located in the City of Helotes in response to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. COVID-19 has had, and continues to have, a significant impact on our local economy by limiting the services that may be offered by many City businesses or causing their temporary closure, resulting in layoffs and financial hardship. In the interest of reducing the economic impact of COVID-19 on local businesses located within the City of Helotes, the HEDC Board of Directors and Staff propose this program to assist our local businesses.

Staff contacted Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) lenders to seek a partnership with the EDC and to administer the program. A Special HEDC meeting was held on April 30, 2020 to discuss program needs, setting the program parameters and decide on a CDFI lender to administer the program. The program will provide a minimum of \$5,000.00 to a maximum of \$20,000.00 in zero (0%) interest loans to each eligible Helotes small business that has been adversely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic until available funds are allocated. The EDC will partner with BCL of Texas to administer the program. The total funding for the program is \$336,000.00 to include total loan distribution and administration fee to be paid over a thirty-six (36) month period.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The current recordation of the land includes a non-conforming cell tower site that was in existence when the City annexed the property. The property was annexed on December 8, 2005 (Ordinance No. 293). The non-conforming cell tower site is accessible by means of an electrical easement (annotated on the plat).

The property's zoning designation is Single-Family Residential District (R-1). Pursuant to Code, cell towers are prohibited in an R-1 zoning district. The owners, Polk Family Trust, would like to have the option to sell the property, and have subsequently requested to legally plat the tract without the cell tower site. No construction is proposed for this property.

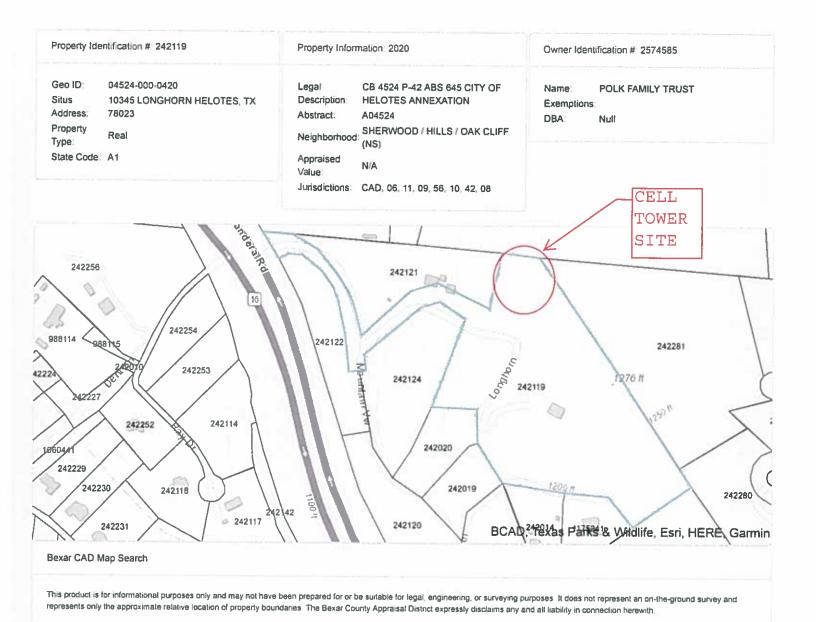

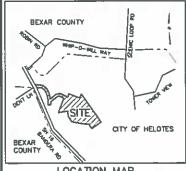
There is an existing residence onsite with existing electric service, existing water well, and existing septic tank. No new service is being requested or anticipated.

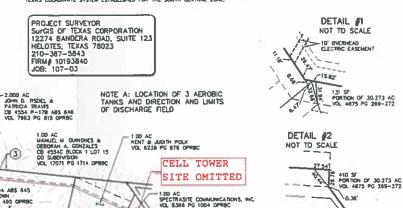

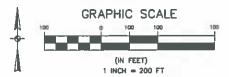

CAPTION: Discussion of and action on reinstating brush pick up by C-6 starting Monday June 1st or providing compensation to Helotes C6 customers.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: On April 2, 2020, the City Council learned in an email written by Mayor Tom Schoolcraft to Helotes resident Bob Hoeppner that the City had cancelled Spring Brush Pick-up. The mayor did not consult with the City Council, the body that approved the contract with C-6 on February 2017 with all its stipulations, including two annual brush and bulk pick-ups. The decision to suspend or continue brush pick-up resides with the City Council, not the Mayor. This is no different from the time the C-6 contract was brought to Council to consider revising the waste company's fee during the "gas crisis." The COVID-19 emergency does not give the Mayor the right to unilaterally change the contractual agreement between the City and C-6, inasmuch as the activity of trash and brush pickup is not a prohibited activity in any of the Executive Orders or guidelines that have been handed down from the Governor or County. In his letter to Mr. Hoeppner, the Mayor wrote, "It's important to note that this was our decision, not C6's. C6 is capable of completing the brush pick-up and was prepared to go forward with it. However, Helotes is obligated to comply with the declarations and executive orders issued by Governor Abbott and County Judge Nelson Wolff."

Included in this packet are Executive Order NW-03 Issued March 23, 2020 and Executive Order NW-05 issued April 6, 2020 by Judge Nelson Wolff. In both orders, under Exempt Businesses: Trash and recycling collection, processing and disposal are described as Services Necessary to Maintain Residences or Support Exempt Businesses. These orders are still in effect and have not been rescinded. Also included is a letter by Texas Attorney General dated March 25, 2020, which states that Governor Abbott's Executive Order GA-08 (Mar. 19, 2020) provided that "all critical infrastructure will remain operational and government entities and businesses will continue providing essential services." This letter also explains that the "Constitution does not allow local actions to impair the obligation of State contracts" and his "order expressly allows government entities to continue performing essential services."

Many residents have contacted Councilmembers Alan Holmes and Cynthia Massey voicing their displeasure and disbelief over this decision to cancel brush pickup. One resident even went to the home of Councilmember Holmes to discuss this issue. There have been several emails by concerned citizens and one who spoke during Citizens to be Heard at our City Council meeting

on April 23. Of all times one would choose to cancel brush pickup, this was not the time. With so many people "Sheltered-In-Place" and with so many of our properties of significant size and heavily treed, what people have been doing since the end of March is yard work anticipating the Spring brush pickup. There are many brush piles along the street and in front yards in our city's subdivisions. The piles are dry and brittle by now and constitute a fire hazard. They were, in most cases, put out before it became known that the City would cancel our Spring brush-pickup. Our citizens should not have to pay a private brush company for a service for which they have already paid.

We request that C-6 resumes its contractual responsibility.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NW-03 OF COUNTY JUDGE NELSON W. WOLFF ISSUED March 23, 2020

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 418.108, Bexar County Judge Nelson W. Wolff declared a state of local disaster on March 13, 2020 due to imminent threat arising from COVID-19;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 418.108(b), on March 18, 2020, the Bexar County Commissioners Court approved an Order Continuing Declaration of State of Local Disaster for Bexar County (hereafter, the "Order of Continuation of Declaration");

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 418.108(b), the consent by Commissioners Court authorizes the Bexar County Judge to continue to exercise the powers granted by the Texas Disaster Act of 1975 for the period specified in the Order of Continuing Declaration;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Texas Governor Greg Abbott issued a declaration of public health disaster in and for the State of Texas and on March 19, 2020, the Texas Department of State Health Services issued a declaration of a public health disaster in the State of Texas for the first time since 1901;

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020 the Bexar County Commissioners Court approved the Order of Continuation of Declaration and authorized the Bexar County Judge to take such actions as are necessary in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Bexar County;

WHERAS, the County Judge has determined that extraordinary emergency measures must be taken to mitigate the effects of this public health emergency and to facilitate a cooperative response; and

WHEREAS, to remain consistent with the declaration of the Texas Department of State Health Services and the executive order issued by Governor Greg Abbott as of March 19, 2020 and to harmonize, to the extent possible, the executive orders of Governor Greg Abbott, the Bexar County Judge and the mandates contained in the declaration of the Mayor of the City of San Antonio, as extended, I hereby rescind my previous Executive Order as issued on March 19, 2020 and issue this Executive Order in its place.

PURSUANT TO THE TEXAS DISASTER ACT OF 1975, BEXAR COUNTY JUDGE NELSON W. WOLFF HEREBY ISSUES THIS EXECUTIVE ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

- Le Effective as of 11:59 p.m. on Tuesday, March 24, 2020, and continuing throughe 11:59 p.m. on April 9, 2020, unless extended, terminated early by Bexar Countye Judge Nelson W. Wolff or otherwise indicated below:e
 - 1.e Subject to the definitions and further guidance set out in Subsection (i) below, e that all persons currently residing within the incorporated and unincorporatede territory of Bexar County are hereafter directed to stay at home ("Stay Home Work Safe Measures"). All persons may only leave their residences to engagee in allowable activities which shall include Exempted Activities or Exemptede Businesses (as defined below) but must implement all social distancinge requirements and adopt other mitigating measures. All public or privatee gatherings of any number of people occurring outside a single household aree hereafter prohibited, except as otherwise provided herein. Nothing in thise Executive Order prohibits the gathering of members within a household.e
 - 2.e With the exception of Exempted Businesses, as defined below, that alle businesses operating within Bexar County are required to cease all activities ate any facility located in the incorporated or unincorporated portions of Bexare County. Notwithstanding the above requirement to cease all activities, thise prohibition shall not extend to: (i) employees or contractors performinge activities at their own residences (i.e. working from home or operation of ae home-based businesses regardless of whether it constitutes an Exemptede Business); (ii) operations to maintain security, upkeep, and maintenance of e premises, equipment or inventory; (iii) IT or other operations that facilitatee employees working from home.e

(i)e Definitions of Exempted Business and Exempted Individual Activity:

(a) For purposes of this Executive Order, Exempted Activities are defined ase follows:e

- i)e Health and Safety Activities. For example, to engage in activities ore perform tasks essential to their health and safety, or to the health ande safety of their family or household members (for example, obtaining food, e medical supplies or medication, visiting a health care professional, ore obtaining supplies needed to work from home) or to care for a familye member or pet in another household.e
- ii)e Necessary Supplies. To obtain necessary services or supplies fore themselves and their family or household members, or to deliver thosee services or supplies to others (for example, food, pet supply, and any othere

- household consumer products, and products necessary to maintain the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences);
- iii)eOutdoor Activity. To engage in activity in an outdoor open space, suche as walking, biking, hiking, or running, provided the individuals complye with social distancing requirements of six feet; and/ore
- iv)eWork at an Exempted Business. Activities necessary to work at ore conduct an Exempted Business or to otherwise carry out activitiese specifically permitted in this Executive Order.e

(b) For purposes of this Executive Order, Exempted Businesses are defined ase follows:

- i)e Healthcare Services. For example, healthcare operations, includinge hospitals, clinics, dentists. pharmacies, pharmaceutical biotechnology companies, other healthcare facilities, healthcaree suppliers, mental health providers, substance abuse service providers,e blood banks, medical research, laboratory services, or any related and/ore ancillary healthcare services. Home-based and residential-based care fore seniors, adults, or children are also considered healthcare operations.e Healthcare operations also includes veterinary care and all healthcaree services provided to animals. This exemption shall be viewed broadlye to avoid any impacts to the delivery of healthcare. operations do not include fitness and exercise gyms and similar facilities. Healthcare operations do not include elective medical. surgical, and dental procedures.
- ii)e Government Functions. For example, those services provided by locale governments needed to ensure the continuing operation of thee government agencies to provide for the health, safety and welfare of thee public including law enforcement and operation of jails and detentione facilities, fire and EMS or otherwise necessary for health and safety of e residents of Bexar County.e
- iii)e Education and Research. To include educators or other personnele supporting public and private K-12 schools, colleges, and universitiese for purposes of facilitating distance learning or performing othere functions in support of Exempted Individual Activities or Exemptede Businesses and companies engaged in science or engineering researche and development.e
- iv)e Infrastructure, Development, Operation and Construction. Fore example, public works construction, construction of housing or othere types of construction including commercial, manufacturing, airporte operations and aircraft manufacturing, maintenance or repair, water, e sewer gas, electrical, oil refining, roads and highways, publice transportation, solid waste collection and removal, internet, ande telecommunications systems (including the provision of essentiale global, national, and local infrastructure for computing services, e business infrastructure, communications, and web-based services).e

- v)e Transportation. Businesses related to the operation, maintenance,e construction, and manufacture of transportation services. For example,e a)evehicle manufacturers, automotive suppliers and parts departments,e car dealerships, parts distributers, maintenance and repair facilities; b)e public transportation; c) businesses supporting airport operations; d)e street and highway maintenance and construction; e) gas stations ande other fuel distribution businesses; f) vehicles for hire including taxis ande rideshare.e
- vi)e IT Services. For example, businesses and activity necessary to maintaine internet and telecommunications systems, including the provision of essential global, national, and local infrastructure for computinge services, business infrastructure, communications, and web-basede services.e
- vii)e Food, Household Staples and Retail. For example, food servicee providers, including grocery stores, warehouse stores, big-box stores, e liquor stores, bodegas, gas stations, and farmers' markets that sell foode products and household staples for pick-up or businesses that ship ore deliver groceries, food, goods or services directly to residences. Nothinge shall restrict employees supporting pick-up or delivery under thise exception so long as there is sufficient space to implement sociale distancing. Restaurants prepared food retailers, microbreweries, microdistilleries, or wineries and other facilities that prepare and serve food, but only for delivery, curbside pick-up or carry out. Schools ande other entities that typically provide free services to students or memberse of the public on a pick-up/take-away basis.e
- viii) Services to Economically Disadvantaged Populations. For example, e transit services, nonprofits and other businesses that provide food, e shelter, and social services, and other necessities of life fore economically disadvantaged or otherwise needy individuals.e
- ix)e Services Necessary to Maintain Residences or Support Exempt Businesses. For example, hotels and other temporary residencee facilities, laundromats, dry cleaners, and laundry service providers,e trash and recycling collection, processing and disposal, mail ande shipping services. building cleaning and warehouse/distribution and fulfillment, and storage for Essentiale Businesses. This shall include plumbers, electricians, exterminators,e and other service providers who provide services that are necessary toe maintaining the safety, sanitation, and essential operations of e residences, Essential Activities, and Exempted Businesses. Professionale services, such as legal or accounting services, when necessary to assiste in compliance with legally mandated activities.e
- x)e News Media. To include newspapers, television, radio, and other mediae services.e
- xi)e Financial Institutions and Insurance Services. To include banks,e credit unions, and other financial institutions and service providers ase well as companies providing insurance services and products.e

- xii)eChildcare Services. To include childcare facilities providing servicese that enable employees exempted in this Executive Order to work ase permitted.e
- xiii) Worship Services. Religious and worship services may only bee provided by video, teleconference or other remote measures.e
- xiv) & Funeral Services. For example, funeral homes, crematoriums ande cemeteries.e
- xv)e CISA Sectors. All business and operations necessary to the operationse and maintenance of the 16 critical infrastructure sectors as identified bye the National Cybersecurity Infrastructure Agency ("CISA") ande outlined at: https://www.cisa.gov/sites/default/files/publications/CISA-Guidance-on-Essential-Critical-Infrastructure-Workers-1-20-508c.pdf e
- 3.e That Bexar County rental property owners temporarily suspend evictions for ate least the next 30 days to prevent renters from being displaced due to the publice health emergency;e
- 4.e That foreclosure proceedings within Bexar County be temporarily suspendede for at least the next 30 days to prevent the displacement of occupants duringe the public health emergency;e
- 5.e That residents of Bexar County conduct essential Bexar County business onlinee or via regular mail to avoid visiting any Bexar County facilities unlesse absolutely necessary.e
- 6.e That no person shall sell any of the following goods or services for more thane the price the person charged for the goods or serves on 11:59 p.m. on Thursday,e March 19, 2020 and continuing during the pendency of this Executive Order:e
 - 1)eGroceries, beverages, toilet articles, ice;e
 - 2)eRestaurant, cafeteria, and boarding-house meals; ande
 - 3) eMedicine, pharmaceutical, and medical equipment and supplies.e
- 7.e That as of the date of this Executive Order and continuing for the remainder ofe the period set out in the joint third amended emergency order of the Supremee Court of Texas in Misc. Docket No. 20-9044 and the Court of Criminal Appealse of Texas in Misc. Docket No. 20-008, all courts within Bexar County restricte non-essential in person proceedings in accordance with this Executive Ordere and the Declaration of Public Health Emergency of the City of San Antonio.e Section 9 of this Executive Order shall hereby be suspended as to this Sectione 7.e
- 8.e That people who are sick should stay at home and not engage in any activitye outside of their residence unless related to treatment or health care. If someonee in a household has tested positive for COVID-19, then the other members of e the household should consider themselves positive if they become symptomatice

- and follow the current policies and procedures in place for isolation and quarantine.
- 9. That any peace officer or other person with lawful authority is hereby authorized to enforce the provisions of this Executive Order in accordance with the authority granted under the Texas Disaster Act of 1975. Any person who violates this Executive Order may be subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or confinement for a period not exceeding 180 days.
- 10. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Executive Order are severable and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Executive Order should be declared invalid by the final judgment or decree of any court or competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections that can be given effect without the invalid provision, and to this end, the provisions of this Executive Order are severable.
- II. All provisions of the executive orders of Governor Greg Abbott either existing or as, if and when issued, shall be automatically incorporated into and constitute terms of this Executive Order enforceable as if set forth herein without necessity for the issuance of any further orders. To the extent that there is a conflict between this Executive Order and any executive order of the Governor, the strictest order shall prevail.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NW-05 OF COUNTY JUDGE NELSON W. WOLFF ISSUED APRIL 6, 2020

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 418.108, Bexar County Judge Nelson W. Wolff declared a state of local disaster on March 13, 2020 due to imminent threat arising from COVID-19;

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 418.108(b), on March 18, 2020, the Bexar County Commissioners Court approved an Order Continuing Declaration of State of Local Disaster for Bexar County (hereafter, the "Order of Continuation of Declaration");

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 418.108(b), the consent by Commissioners Court authorizes the Bexar County Judge to continue to exercise the powers granted by the Texas Disaster Act of 1975 for the period specified in the Order of Continuing Declaration;

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Texas Governor Greg Abbott issued a declaration of public health disaster in and for the State of Texas and on March 19, 2020, the Texas Department of State Health Services issued a declaration of a public health disaster in the State of Texas for the first time since 1901;

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020 the Bexar County Commissioners Court approved the Order of Continuation of Declaration and authorized the Bexar County Judge to take such actions as are necessary in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Bexar County;

WHERAS, the County Judge has determined that extraordinary emergency measures must be taken to mitigate the effects of this public health emergency and to facilitate a response to the public health threat;

WHEREAS, a County Judge is authorized to control ingress to and egress from a disaster area and control the movement of persons and occupancy of premises on an appropriate local scale in accordance with Section 418.108(g) of the Texas Government Code and his authority as Emergency Management Director; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Executive Order to remain as consistent with and to harmonize, to the extent possible, the executive orders of Governor Greg Abbott and the mandates contained in the current declaration of the Mayor of the City of San Antonio (as extended or modified);

WHEREAS, by the authority vested in me as Bexar County Judge and as the Emergency Management Director for the County of Bexar to continue to protect the health and safety of the community and address developing and rapidly changing circumstances when presented by the current public health emergency, I hereby rescind my previous Executive Orders and any Supplemental Executive Orders and issue this revised Executive Order in their place.

PURSUANT TO THE TEXAS DISASTER ACT OF 1975, BEXAR COUNTY JUDGE NELSON W. WOLFF HEREBY ISSUES THIS EXECUTIVE ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

- I. Effective as of 11:59 p.m. on Tuesday, April 7, 2020, and continuing through 11:59 p.m. on April 30, 2020 in accordance with executive order GA 14 of Governor Greg Abbott, unless extended, modified or terminated early by Bexar County Judge Nelson W. Wolff or as otherwise indicated below:
 - 1. Subject to the definitions and further guidance set out in Subsection (i) below, that all persons currently residing within the incorporated and unincorporated territory of Bexar County are hereafter directed to stay at home ("Stay Home Work Safe Measures"). All persons may only leave their residences to engage in allowable activities which shall include Exempted Activities or Exempted Businesses (as defined below) but must implement all social distancing requirements and adopt other mitigating measures. All public or private gatherings of any number of people occurring outside a single household are hereafter prohibited, except as otherwise provided herein. Nothing in this Executive Order prohibits the gathering of members within a household.
 - 2. With the exception of Exempted Businesses, as defined below, that all businesses operating within Bexar County are required to cease all activities at any facility located in the incorporated or unincorporated portions of Bexar County. Notwithstanding the above requirement to cease all activities, this prohibition shall not extend to: (i) employees or contractors performing activities at their own residences (i.e. working from home or operation of a home-based businesses regardless of whether it constitutes an Exempted Business); (ii) operations to maintain security, upkeep, and maintenance of premises, equipment or inventory; (iii) IT or other operations that facilitate employees working from home.

(i) <u>Definitions of Exempted Business and Exempted Individual Activity:</u>

(a) For purposes of this Executive Order, Exempted Activities are defined as follows:

- i) Health and Safety Activities. For example, to engage in activities or perform tasks essential to their health and safety, or to the health and safety of their family or household members (for example, obtaining food, medical supplies or medication, visiting a health care professional, or obtaining supplies needed to work from home) or to care for a family member or pet in another household.
- Necessary Supplies. To obtain necessary services or supplies for themselves and their family or household members, or to deliver those services or supplies to others (for example, food, pet supply, and any other household consumer products, and products necessary to maintain the safety, sanitation, and essential operation of residences);
- ii) Outdoor Activity. To engage in activity in an outdoor open space, such as walking, biking, hiking, or running, provided the individuals comply with social distancing requirements of six feet; and/or
- iii) Work at an Exempted Business. Activities necessary to work at or conduct an Exempted Business or to otherwise carry out activities specifically permitted in this Executive Order.
- (b) For purposes of this Executive Order, Exempted Businesses are defined as follows:
 - i) **Healthcare Services**. Business activity related to the providing or delivering of healthcare services. For example:
 - 1. hospitals, clinics, dentists, pharmacies, pharmaceutical and biotechnology companies, other healthcare facilities, including veterinary services,
 - 2. healthcare suppliers, home healthcare services providers, mental health providers, substance abuse providers,
 - 3. blood banks, medical research, or any related and/or ancillary healthcare services, veterinary care provided to animals.
 - 4. Home-based care for seniors, adults, or children. Residential facilities and shelters for seniors, adults, and children.

 Healthcare services do not include fitness and exercise gyms and similar facilities and do not include elective medical, surgical, and

dental procedures

- ii) Government Functions. For example, business activity related to the operations or services provided by government for the continuing operation of the government or its agencies to provide for the health, safety and welfare of the public, including, but not limited to, public safety, solid waste collection, and utility operations.
- iii) Education and Research. To include educators or other personnel supporting public and private K-12 schools, colleges, and universities for purposes of facilitating distance learning or performing other functions in support of Exempted Individual Activities or Exempted Businesses and those companies engaged in science or engineering research and development.

- iv) Infrastructure, Development, Operation and Construction. For example, public works construction, construction of housing or other types of construction including commercial, manufacturing, airport operations and aircraft manufacturing, maintenance or repair, water, sewer gas, electrical, oil refining, roads and highways, public transportation, solid waste collection and removal, internet, and telecommunications systems (including the provision of essential global, national, and local infrastructure for computing services, business infrastructure, communications, and web-based services).
- v) **Transportation**. Business related to the operation, maintenance, construction, and manufacture of transportation services. For example:
 - 1. Vehicle manufacturers, automotive suppliers, car dealerships, parts distribution, maintenance and repair facilities
 - 2. Public transportation
 - 3. Businesses supporting airport operations
 - 4. Street and highway maintenance and construction
 - 5. Gas stations and other fuel distribution businesses
 - 6. Vehicles for hire including taxis and rideshare
- vi) IT Services. For example, businesses and activity necessary to maintain internet and telecommunications systems, including the provision of essential global, national, and local infrastructure for computing services, business infrastructure, communications, and web-based services.
- vii) Food, Household Staples and Retail. For example, food service and food distribution providers including grocery stores, warehouse stores, big-box stores, liquor stores, bodegas, gas stations, and farmers' markets that sell food products and household staples. Businesses that ship or deliver groceries, food, goods or services directly to residences or provide for pick-up options, including restaurants. Notwithstanding the above exemption, all exempted food, household staples and retail establishments, including those doing pick-up/delivery shall:
 - i. Limit the amount of people at pickup or in an establishment so that social distancing may be maintained;
 - ii. Implement an organized line system where people are spaced at least 6 feet apart; and
 - iii. Post in a highly visible location, the establishment's guidelines that meet (a) and (b) above.

The restriction of delivery or carry out does not apply to cafes and restaurants located within hospital and medical facilities. Schools and other entities that typically provide free services to students or members of the public on a pick-up/take-away basis may continue. Laundromats, dry cleaners, and laundry service providers and businesses that supply products needed for people to work from home are included in Household Staples Retail.

- vii) Services to Economically Disadvantaged Populations. For example, transit services, nonprofits and other businesses that provide food, shelter, and social services, and other necessities of life for economically disadvantaged or other vulnerable individuals.
- viii) Services Necessary to Maintain Residences or Support Exempt Businesses. For example,
 - 1. Hotels and other temporary residence facilities,
 - 2. Trash and recycling collection, processing and disposal,
 - mail and shipping services, building cleaning and maintenance, auto repair, warehouse/distribution and fulfillment, and storage for essential businesses,
 - 4. Plumbers, electricians, exterminators, moving services and other service providers who provide services to maintain the safety, sanitation, and operations of residences, and
 - 5. Professional services, such as legal or accounting services when necessary to assist in compliance with legally mandated activities, such as filing of taxes.
- ix) News Media. To include newspapers, television, radio, and other media services.
- x) Financial Institutions and Insurance Services. To include banks, credit unions, and other financial institutions and nontraditional lending businesses and service providers as well as companies providing insurance services and products.
- xii) Childcare Services. To include licensed childcare facilities, organizations, or individuals providing childcare services.
- xiii) Worship Services. Religious services conducted in churches, congregations, and houses of worship, but by remote audio, video, or teleconference whenever possible in accordance with Governor Greg Abbott's executive order GA 14 and the guidance provided by that office.
- xiv) Funeral Services. For example, funeral homes, crematoriums and cemeteries.
- xv) CISA Sectors. All businesses and industries listed by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security in its Guidance on the Essential Critical Infrastructure Workforce, Version 2.0 available at: https://www.cisa.gov/sites/default/files/publications/CISA Guidance on the Essential Critical Infrastructure Workforce Version 2.0 Update d.pdf
- xvi) Other Essential Services. Those services added to a list of essential services by approval of the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM). TDEM shall maintain an online list of essential services, as specified in the executive order of Governor Greg Abbott and in any approved additions and those deemed as essential services by TDEM shall automatically be incorporated into this Executive Order.

- 3. That Bexar County rental property owners temporarily suspend evictions during the pendency of this Executive Order to prevent renters from being displaced due to the public health emergency.
- 4. That foreclosure proceedings within Bexar County be temporarily suspended during the pendency of this Executive Order to prevent the displacement of occupants during the public health emergency.
- 5. That the following restrictions, limitations or requirements shall apply to all parks, private and public recreational areas and golf courses as follows:

a. Bexar County Public Parks

- i. That County-owned community centers, civil centers, clubhouses, adult and senior centers (except for meal pick up), park badminton courts, ballfields, basketball courts, bocce ball courts, handball courts, outdoor exercise equipment, pickle ball courts, playgrounds, racquetball courts, skate plazas, splash pads, squash courts, tennis courts, and volley ball shall be closed to the public. These closures will remain in effect until this Executive Order NW-05 of the Bexar County Judge and the Texas Governor's Executive Order GA-14 are rescinded or expire.
- ii. Beginning at 11:59 PM on Friday, April 10, 2020 that all persons must vacate County parks and all County parks will be closed to the public until 5:00 AM on Monday, April 13, 2020. Park trails, linear parks, and greenways will remain open for walking, running, or biking as long as users consistently follow social distancing.

b. Private and Public Recreational Areas

- i. That all public and private recreational areas where social distancing and sanitizing requirements are difficult or impossible to meet, including community, school, apartment, private club and Home Owner Association, badminton courts, ballfields, basketball courts, bocce ball courts, handball courts, outdoor exercise equipment, pickle ball courts, playgrounds, racquetball courts, skate plazas, splash pads, squash courts, tennis courts, and volley ball courts be closed for the duration of this Executive Order.
- ii. Community, school, apartment, private club and Homeowner Association park trails, linear parks and greenways may remain open for walking, running, or biking as long as users consistently follow social distancing.

c. Golf Courses

- i. That all golf courses and driving ranges shall remain closed for golf or frisbee play until further notice.
- 6. That in order to reduce the risk of transmission of COVID 19 among vulnerable populations in long-term care facilities:
 - a. Any individual providing in-person services, or who is otherwise employed or staffs a long-term care facility (e.g. nursing home, or assisted living facility), and has direct patient contact shall be prohibited from working in, or visiting, more than (1) long-term care facility for any purpose as a result of the increased risk for transmission of COVID-19 to an at-risk population. This prohibition is based on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) identifying that staff members working in multiple long-term care facilities can contribute to intra- and interfacility spread of COVID-19. The prohibition shall extend to any agency or organization who employs individuals for purposes of staffing or on a temporary basis. Notwithstanding, this prohibition does not, and is not intended to, impact or restrict the ability of an individual, organization or entity to operate as an exempted business under the Order/Declaration of either the Texas Governor or the County Judge for Bexar County, but shall only restrict the ingress/egress and movement of persons into or out of more than one nursing home facility. Additionally, long-term care facilities should follow all additional CDC guidance to take proactive steps to protect the health of residents and preserve the health care workforce by identifying and excluding potentially infected staff members, restricting visitation consistent with the Governor's Executive Order, the Mayor's Fifth Declaration and the County Judge's Executive Order, ensuring early recognition of potentially infected patients, and implementing appropriate infection control measures;
 - b. In accordance with executive order GA 08 of Governor Greg Abbott, people shall not visit nursing homes, retirement homes or long-term care facilities unless to provide critical services.
- 7. That the Bexar County Justice Center Complex shall have two points of access one at the Paul Elizondo Tower at the Nueva Street entrance and one at the Bexar County Courthouse Bexar Heritage Center entrance and that all other county-owned or leased buildings shall have a single controlled point of entrance. Further, all citizens and employees be shall be appropriately screened before entering any Bexar County owned or leased building. At the control

points, citizens and employees shall be asked certain risk-related questions and their temperature taken by least obtrusive means. Any individual with a temperature exceeding 100 °F or who fails the screening process will be not be allowed to enter the building. Citizens are encouraged to call the department or office you are attempting to visit prior to visiting a county-owned or leased facility. All social distancing measures must be implemented at the above-described control points.

- 8. That residents of Bexar County conduct essential Bexar County business online or via regular mail to avoid visiting any Bexar County facilities unless absolutely necessary.
- 9. That during the pendency of this Executive Order, no person or business entity ("Seller") shall engage in price gouging by selling any of the following goods or services for more than the regular retail price the Seller charged for the goods or services on March 19, 2020, except where an increased retail price is the result of documented cost increases from suppliers or other similar cost increases (including the loss of supplier funds to support products):
 - 1) Groceries, beverages, toilet articles, ice;
 - 2) Restaurant, cafeteria, and boarding-house meals; or
 - 3) Medicine, pharmaceutical, and medical equipment and supplies.
- 10. That as of the date of this Executive Order and continuing for the remainder of the period of the joint third amended emergency order of the Supreme Court of Texas in Misc. Docket No. 20-9044 and the Court of Criminal Appeals of Texas in Misc. Docket No. 20-008, all courts within Bexar County restrict non-essential in person proceedings in accordance with this Executive Order and the Declaration of Public Health Emergency of the City of San Antonio. Section 9 of this Executive Order shall hereby be suspended as to this Section 7.
- 11. That due to the risk of a COVID-19 outbreak in the Bexar County Adult Detention Center:
 - a. I hereby direct that the Bexar County District Attorney's Office, the Public Defender's Office, the Office of Criminal Justice Policy, Planning & Programs, the District and County Clerks and the judiciary continue to work diligently together with the Bexar County Sheriff's Office to identify persons whose charged offenses and backgrounds pose little to no risk to public safety and who may be eligible for pretrial release.

- b. I further direct that those offices and instrumentalities take appropriate action to provide for the immediate release of the individuals so identified in Section 11(a) above in accordance with any applicable law in order to mitigate the grave threat posed by a concentrated outbreak of COVID-19 in the facility.
- c. Under no circumstances shall this Executive Order be interpreted in a manner as to require or direct the release on personal bond of any person previously convicted of a crime that involves physical violence or the threat of physical violence, or any person currently arrested for such a crime that is supported by probable cause in violation of executive order GA 13.
- 12. That people who are sick should stay at home and not engage in any activity outside of their residence unless related to treatment or health care. If someone in a household has tested positive for COVID-19, then the other members of the household should consider themselves positive if they become symptomatic and follow the current policies and procedures in place for isolation and quarantine.
- 13. That any peace officer or other person with lawful authority is hereby authorized to enforce the provisions of this Executive Order in accordance with the authority granted under the Texas Disaster Act of 1975. Any person who violates this Executive Order may be subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or confinement for a period not exceeding 180 days.
- 14. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Executive Order are severable and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Executive Order should be declared invalid by the final judgment or decree of any court or competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections that can be given effect without the invalid provision, and to this end, the provisions of this Executive Order are severable.
- II. All provisions of the executive orders of Governor Greg Abbott either existing or as, if and when issued, which are made applicable to all jurisdictions by law shall be automatically incorporated into and constitute terms of this Executive Order, enforceable as if set forth herein without necessity for the issuance of any further orders.

To: All Elected and Appointed State Officials, Executive Directors, Board Members, and Agency Officers

Our office has received numerous questions about the extent to which State agencies. State officials, and State agents may be impacted by disaster declarations and orders issued by political subdivisions that restrict the movement of persons and the operation of businesses within their respective jurisdictions. We conclude that political subdivisions may not restrict the ability of any State agency, State agent or State contractor to provide governmental services.

On March 13, 2020, Governor Abbott declared a state of disaster in all Texas counties in response to the novel coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), authorizing the use of all available State and local resources that are reasonably necessary to cope with the disaster. The Governor of the State Texas, Proclamation of March 13, 2020. Subsequently, Governor Abbott issued an executive order to further mitigate the spread of COVID-19. Executive Order GA-08 (Mar. 19, 2020). Importantly, this order provided that "[a]Il critical infrastructure will remain operational, and government entities and businesses will continue providing essential services." *Id.* at 2 (emphasis added).

Questions about continuing operations of State government have arisen because various political subdivisions have declared local states of disaster and issued related orders restricting the movement of persons and the operation of businesses and entities located within their jurisdictions. These declarations and orders are not uniform in their purported application: some expressly recognize that the local orders do not purport to control the operations of the State or Federal Governments, whereas others do not contain such express exemptions.

The Texas Disaster Act of 1975 authorizes the Governor to declare a state of disaster if a disaster has occurred or the threat or occurrence of a disaster is imminent. Tex. Gov't Code § 418.014(a). A declaration by the Governor activates the State's emergency management plans and authorizes the use of any necessary forces and emergency supplies. *Id.* § 418.015(a). In addition, the Governor may use all available resources of the State and of any political subdivision that are reasonably necessary to respond to the disaster and may control access to and the movement of people and occupancy of premises within a disaster area. *Id.* §§ 418.017(a), .018(c).

Likewise, the Act authorizes the presiding officer of the governing body of a political subdivision to declare a local state of disaster. *Id.* § 418.108(a). A declaration by the local officer activates the applicable local emergency response plans. *Id.* § 418.108(d). Like the Governor, local officers may also control access to and the movement of people and occupancy of premises within a disaster area. *Id.* § 418.108(g). Yet, unlike the Governor's authority, local officers may only exercise authority in an "area under the jurisdiction and authority of" the officer. *Id.*

As a general matter, the State, its agencies and its property are not under the jurisdiction and authority of a local officer under section 418.108. The State of Texas is a free and sovereign state, subject only to the United States and Texas Constitutions. See Tex. Const. art. I, § 1. Conversely, local governments derive their existence and power from the State and are confined to regulating only as consistent with the State Constitution and laws. See id. art. XI, § 5 (providing that no ordinance shall be inconsistent with the Constitution or general laws of the State); Tex. Gov't Code §§ 51.012, .032 (providing that municipal ordinances may not be inconsistent with state law); City of Laredo. Tex. v. Laredo Merchants Assoc., 550 S.W.3d 586, 592 (Tex. 2018) (same).

Local authority to control the movement of people and the occupancy of premises under local states of disaster are expressly limited to those areas "under the jurisdiction and authority of' the local officer. Tex. Gov't Code § 418.108(g). As agents of the State, local governments lack authority to control the State and its agencies. See e.g., Tex. Att'y Gen. Ops. JM-117 (1983) at 2–3 (concerning building and zoning ordinances), MW-508 (1982) at 4–5 (concerning city fire codes), M-182 (1968) at 2 (concerning municipal building permits): see also Tex. Gov't Code § 211.013(c) (excluding property owned or controlled by the state or federal government from zoning regulations). Moreover, the State does not subject itself to local regulation simply by granting authority to local governments to regulate. See Tex. Att'y Gen. Op. M-182 (1968) at 2. Because the State and its agencies and property are not under the jurisdiction or authority of local officials for purposes of section 418.108, local action under that provision cannot circumscribe State functions.

Nor does the Constitution allow local actions to impair the obligation of State contracts. See Tex. Const. art. I. § 16. Where, as here, fulfilling State functions may include utilizing the services of State contractors, the Constitution expressly prohibits enacting any law—state or local—that impairs that right.

Furthermore, under the Act Governor Abbott "may issue executive orders, proclamations, and regulations and amend or rescind them." Tex. Gov't Code § 418.012. These orders, proclamations, and regulations "have the force and effect of law." *Id.* As such, they constitute general laws of the State. And because local governments cannot enact laws that are inconsistent with State law, Governor Abbott's orders operate to limit local authority to regulate. *See* Tex. Const. art. XI, § 5; *City of Laredo* 550 S.W.3d at 592. Here, Governor Abbott's order expressly allows government entities to continue performing essential services. Because his order carries the force and effect of law, it supersedes local action to the extent of any conflict.

Discussion of and action on a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Helotes, Texas, approving a project of the Helotes Economic Development Corporation (HEDC) to establish a Small Business Assistance Program that will offer zero (0%) interest loans to businesses within the corporate limits of Helotes that have been impacted by the coronavirus (COVID-19); and authorizing the HEDC Executive Director to take all necessary steps to implement the provisions of this Resolution. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

MEETING DATE: May 14, 2020

The Helotes Economic Development Corporation (HEDC) is a Type B Corporation. Pursuant to Local Government Code, Section 505.158, a Type B Corporation may not undertake a project that requires an expenditure of more than \$10,000.00 until the governing body of the corporation's authorizing municipality adopts a Resolution authorizing the project after giving the Resolution at least two separate readings.

HEDC staff has researched several programs to provide financial assistance to small businesses located in the City of Helotes in response to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. COVID-19 has had, and continues to have, a significant impact on our local economy by limiting the services that may be offered by many City businesses or causing their temporary closure, resulting in layoffs and financial hardship. In the interest of reducing the economic impact of COVID-19 on local businesses located within the City of Helotes, the HEDC Board of Directors and Staff propose this program to assist our local businesses.

Staff contacted Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) lenders to seek partnership with the EDC and to administer the program. A Special HEDC meeting was held on April 30, 2020 to discuss program needs, setting the program parameters, and decide on a CDFI lender to administer the program. The program will provide a minimum of \$5,000.00 to a maximum of \$20,000.00 in zero (0%) interest loans to each eligible Helotes small business that has been adversely impacted by COVID-19 pandemic until available funds are allocated.

Some of the eligibility requirements for each business prior to receiving assistance through the program is each Helotes business must first demonstrate its needs for the funds, and must meet these minimum qualifications:

- Located within the corporate limits of the City of Helotes and must be in current compliance with the City of Helotes Code of Ordinances, including all applicable zoning and land use ordinances
- Not a home-based business.
- Must have a current Certificate of Occupancy in Helotes
- Must have been in business since May 2019
- Must be a sales tax producing business
- Must demonstrate a loss of revenue in the period beginning March 1, 2020 due to the COVID-19 crisis using the twelve (12) previous months as a basis
- Must be able to repay the new loan payment
- Must provide verification of available collateral owned free and clear by the business or owner
- Has not received a Bexar County, State or Federal COVID-19 loan or grant; will be evaluated on a case by case basis

A significant number of applications are expected to be received. There are many businesses who are struggling and will continue to struggle due to the economic impact of COVID-19.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The HEDC current unreserved balance is \$816,095.00.

Total funding for the program is \$336,000.00.

- \$300,000.00 Loan Distribution
- \$36,000.00 Administration Fees to be paid monthly over a thirty-six (36) month period.

- Sec. 505.157. PROJECTS RELATED TO BUSINESS ENTERPRISES IN LANDLOCKED COMMUNITIES. (a) In this section, "landlocked community" means a municipality that:
- (1) is wholly or partly located in a county with a population of two million or more; and
- (2) has within its municipal limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction less than 100 acres that can be used for the development of manufacturing or industrial facilities in accordance with the municipality's zoning laws or land use restrictions.
- (b) For a landlocked community that authorizes or has authorized the creation of a Type B corporation, "project" also includes expenditures found by the board of directors to be required for the promotion of new or expanded business enterprises in the landlocked community.

WHEREAS, the City of Helotes, Texas ("City") authorized the creation of the City of Helotes Economic Development Corporation ("HEDC"), a Type B Economic Development Corporation; and

WHEREAS, Texas Local Government Code, Section 505.158, requires that a Type B Corporation may not undertake a project that requires an expenditure of more than \$10,000.00 until the governing body of the corporation's authorizing municipality adopts a Resolution authorizing the project after giving the Resolution at least two separate readings; and

WHEREAS, the HEDC has agreed to appropriate \$336,000.00 from its budget to establish a Small Business Loan Assistance Program to provide immediate, short-term financial assistance in the form of zero interest loans to qualified businesses that have been impacted by the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) located within the corporate city limits of Helotes; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 has been recognized globally as a contagious respiratory virus and has caused closures of and limitations on local businesses; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds the project will assist local businesses to create or retain primary jobs in the municipality and will serve the public health, safety and welfare of the City of Helotes

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HELOTES, TEXAS THAT:

Section One. <u>Approval.</u> The City Council hereby approves the HEDC project, being an appropriation of \$336,000.00 to establish a Small Business Loan Assistance Program.

Section Two. Authorization. The HEDC Executive Director is hereby authorized to take all necessary steps to implement the provisions of this Resolution.

Section Three. <u>Effective Date.</u> This Resolution shall take effect immediately after its passage at a second, separate reading.

Section Four. Recitals. The City Council finds all of the above recitals to be true and correct and incorporates the same in this Resolution as findings of fact.

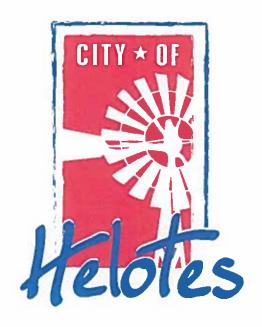

Small Business Assistance Loan Program

Background



- ➤ Bexar County launched a \$5.65M loan and grant program exhausting all funds in two days
- SBA Payroll Protection Program (PPP) ran out of funds April 16th
- HEDC is proposing to create a Small Business Assistance Loan Program (SBALP) for City of Helotes businesses that have suffered financial losses as a result of COVID-19

Overview



- Create a zero interest loan program to offer financial assistance to keep local businesses operational
- ➤ Loans up to \$20,000
 - > 20 or fewer full time employees at all business locations
- ➤ Total funding
 - >\$300,000 Loan Distribution
 - >\$36,000 Administration Fee
- Staff will partner with a Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI) lender BCL of Texas administer the loans

Funding Availability



- The HEDC current unreserved balance of \$816,095
- State law requires Type B organizations to hold a public hearing and wait 60 days before expending funds.
- If approved the soonest the HEDC could release funds would be July 2, 2020

Funding Options



- ▶BCL of Texas informed HEDC that they can provide up to \$200,000 (depending on total loan fund distribution amount) to start up the program and be reimbursed on July 2nd when HEDC funds can be expended.
 - Written into the contract.
 - They have their own working capital for emergency circumstances such as this.

- Once approved, businesses will be required to submit receipts and/or invoices verifying proper use of the funds

Discussion of and action on a Declaration of the City of Helotes, Texas extending a declaration order of local disaster and public health emergency for the City of Helotes as a result of the COVID-19 virus. (Staff)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared that the COVID-19 outbreak should be characterized as a pandemic.

On March 13, 2020, Greg Abbott, the Governor of the State of Texas issued a proclamation that declared COVID-19 as an imminent threat of disaster.

On or around March 15, 2020, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued revised guidance regarding social distancing and mass gatherings of 10 or more people.

City staff continues to work with the state, federal, local authorities and our emergency management team to pay close attention to the federal government's response to the Coronavirus issue. The City has taken measures to close/cancel events through May 31, 2020. The City has canceled all City sponsored social events and activities through this time as well.

On Friday, March 20, 2020, Mayor Schoolcraft proclaimed and signed a Declaration of Local Disaster and Public Health Emergency to be effective until March 27, 2020 for the City of Helotes.

On Thursday, March 26, 2020, City Council approved to extend the Declaration of Local Disaster and Public Health Emergency until May 27, 2020 for the City of Helotes.

The purpose of the Order is to be able to extend the Declaration of Local Disaster and Public Health Emergency for an additional 60 days.

DECLARATION NO. 2020-03

A DECLARATION OF THE CITY OF HELOTES, TEXAS, EXTENDING A DECLARATION ORDER OF LOCAL DISASTER AND PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY FOR THE CITY OF HELOTES AS A RESULT OF THE COVID-19 VIRUS; ESTABLISHING THE COMMENCEMENT DATE AND PERIOD; INCORPORATING RECITALS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.

WHEREAS, the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) has been recognized globally as a contagious respiratory virus; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 continues to spread and to pose an increasing, imminent threat of disaster; and

WHEREAS, on Friday, March 13, 2020 Bexar County Judge issued a declaration of a local disaster and public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, the City of Helotes has followed the Bexar County declaration and cancelled non-essential events; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Texas Disaster Act of 1975, the Mayor is designated as the emergency management director of the City of Helotes, and may exercise the powers granted to the governor on an appropriate local scale; and

WHEREAS, on Friday, March 20, 2020 Mayor Thomas A. Schoolcraft determined that there was an imminent threat resulting from COVID-19 and issued a declaration of local disaster for the City of Helotes for a period of not more than seven (7) days; and

WHEREAS, on March 26, 2020, the City Council adopted Declaration No. 2020-02, continuing and extending the Mayor's amended declaration of local disaster for public health emergency for sixty (60) days to help abate the public health threat resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Helotes has determined that the declaration of local disaster and public health emergency must be extended to respond quickly, prevent and alleviate the suffering of people exposed to and those infected with the virus, as well as those that could potentially be infected or impacted by COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, a declaration of local disaster and public health emergency includes the ability to reduce the possibility of exposure to disease, control the risk, promote health, compel persons to undergo additional health measures that prevent or control the spread of the disease, including isolation, surveillance, quarantine, or placement of persons under public health observations, including the provision of temporary housing or emergency shelters for persons misplaced or evacuated and request assistance from the governor of state resources.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HELOTES, TEXAS THAT:

SECTION ONE. Pursuant to Section 418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code, the Mayor declared a local state of disaster for the City of Helotes on Friday, March 20, 2020.

SECTION TWO. Pursuant to Section 418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code, the state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven (7) days from the date of the declaration unless continued or renewed by the City Council of the City of Helotes. The declaration is hereby renewed and extended by the City Council for a period of sixty (60) days commencing on Friday, May 28, 2020.

<u>SECTION THREE.</u> Pursuant to Section 418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary.

<u>SECTION FOUR.</u> Pursuant to Section 418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the City of Helotes's emergency management plan.

SECTION FIVE. Pursuant to Section 418.108(f) of the Texas Government Code, the Mayor may control ingress to and egress from a disaster within the City and may control movement of persons and the occupancy of premises in the area.

SECTION SIX. Pursuant to Section 418.108(h) of the Texas Government Code, the City of Helotes will, as a minimum standard, follow the evacuation, ingress to and egress from the City and movement and occupancy of premises as ordered by the Bexar County Judge.

SECTION SEVEN. The City Council finds all of the above recitals to be true and correct and incorporates the same in this Order as findings of fact.

SECTION EIGHT. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Order is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or illegal, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections of this Order. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Order, and each section, subsection, clause, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, or phrases be declared void.

SECTION NINE. This Order shall commence on Friday, May 28, 2020 for a period of sixty (60) days.
